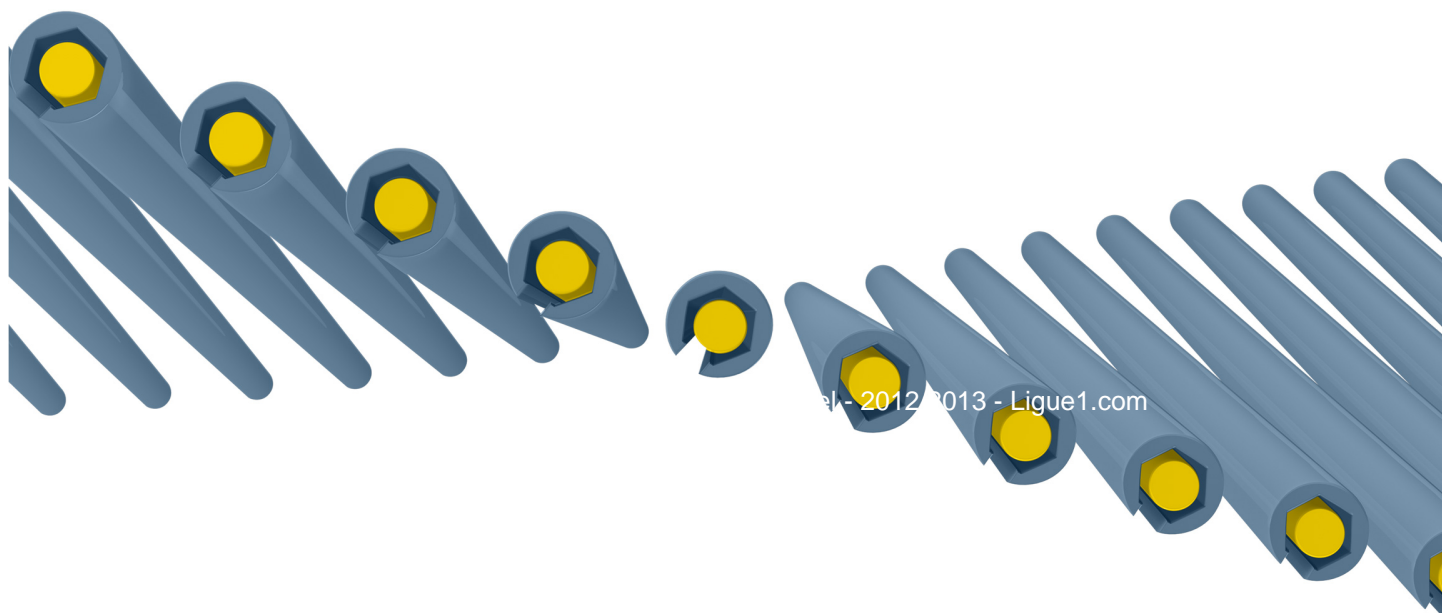

AS Saint-Etienne - Olympique Lyonnais Feature Preview

Ligue 1 leaders coming into the weekend, Olympique Lyonnais will be looking to bolster their position as pre-Christmas pacesetters, though Sunday's derby trip to AS Saint-Etienne promises to be perilous.

With a number of big-name players leaving last summer and only promising youngsters promoted to replace them, few would have bet on Rémi Garde's side doing more than making up the numbers this season. The former Arsenal midfielder has, however, quickly moulded a team not only worth watching but which clearly can compete for a place on the Ligue 1 podium. While they are joint-top of the goalscoring charts along with Valenciennes FC, more significantly, OL also lead the way in the table overall. Last weekend's 1-0 defeat of Montpellier Hérault SC kept Garde's men two points clear of second-placed Olympique de Marseille, and came courtesy of a Bafétimbi Gomis strike. The 27-year-old now has ten league goals this season, and is just four shy of his tally of 14 last time out, which was his best return in OL colours since his move from Saint-Etienne in 2009.

"I dreamed of playing for a big club to help me get into the French national team, for example. I'm proud to have come through the ranks at Saint-Etienne. I'm proud of the improvement I've made. I'm becoming a little more important in the Lyon squad, and I'm more consistent in my performances," said Gomis, who - though almost certain to be given a typical Geoffroy-Guichard welcome for those who have crossed a prickly regional divide - has urged players on both sides to calm local ardours. "We have to show the example in what we say before the game. On the pitch, there will be aggression, but in the right sense. There is a rivalry, and you can feel that after overcoming PSG, they want to win."

If OL appear to be on the road to building the sort of side which can be favourably compared with that which dominated Ligue 1 after the turn of the millennium, then Saint-Etienne still have some work to do before their line-up can match the achievements of their predecessors, whose ten Ligue 1 titles remain a French record.

It is a legacy of the club's glorious past that the hosts hold the upper hand in this fixture, winning 23 of the duo's 46 meetings at the Stade Geoffroy-Guichard compared with the visitors' 11. However, OL's recent domestic hegemony, which brought them seven successive L1 crowns between 2002 and 2008, means they have not lost in 13 competitive visits to Le Chaudron, 'the Cauldron', and have won on their last five trips there in all competitions.

Saint-Etienne coach Christophe Galtier is, however, moulding his squad, which is even younger than their OL counterparts, into a formidable unit. Five points back in third before the weekend's play, Les Verts would have been closer to their neighbours had they been able to overcome a stubborn AC Ajaccio team last weekend in Corsica. The goalless draw did, however, extend Saint-Etienne's unbeaten run to 13 games in all competitions - ten in Ligue 1 - and given that streak includes two victories over Paris Saint-Germain, they are understandably bullish.

"We've had three days' recovery after the Ajaccio game. We really needed it both in body and in mind. The players are giving a lot. We're just preparing for the game normally, with a lot of smiling faces and fun at training. Our plan is already in place. The players will discover it step-by-step. We have to be precise, without putting ourselves under pressure," explained Galtier, who was assistant coach to Alain Perrin when OL won the double in 2008, and who pinpointed another face familiar to both sides as the main threat to his team. "Gomis is in full form. He's a great guy, and a great player. We'll really, really, really go out to try and stop him from scoring, because he's an important part of the Lyon team."





AS Saint-Etienne - Olympique Lyonnais

- HISTORY: There have been 46 L1 meetings between the two Rhône rivals. AS Saint-Etienne have won 23 of those with Olympique Lyonnais successful on 11 occasions.
- OL are unbeaten on their last 12 L1 visits - and 13 in all competitions - to the Stade Geoffroy Guichard, winning six of those top-flight meetings (7 in all competitions).
- OL have won on their last five visits to Saint-Etienne in all competitions, and triumphed in six of their last seven.
- LAST SEASON: An 81st-minute goal by former Saint-Etienne forward Bafétimbi Gomis gave OL a 1-0 win in Week 28. The meeting at the Stade Municipal de Gerland earlier in the season in Week 12 ended 2-0 to Lyon with Jimmy Briand (82') and Yoann Gourcuff (90+1') scoring for the hosts, who had Mouhamadou Dabo, another former Saint-Etienne man in their ranks, dismissed seven minutes into the second half.
- The L1 meeting in Lyon came three days after the duo had met in Saint-Etienne in the Coupe de la Ligue Round of 16. Briand (40') and Michel Bastos (72') helped Lyon to a 2-1 win with Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang (88') getting a late consolation for the hosts.
- AS SAINT-ETIENNE
- ASSE are third in the table with 26 points from 15 games (7W, 5D, 3L).
- ASSE drew 0-0 at AC Ajaccio a week last Friday.
- Saint-Etienne's in-e-up at Ajaccio: Ruffier; Clerc, Bayal, Perrin (c), Ghoulam; Lemoine, Clément (Guilavogui 73'), Cohade; Hamouma (Mayi 85'), Brandao (Alonso 46'), Gradel
- Their 1-0 win at Valenciennes FC 1-0 in Week 14, Romain Hamouma (73') scoring the only goal of the game, took Les Verts to the top of the L1 table for 24 hours.
- Les Verts are now unbeaten in 13 games in all competitions (ten in L1, 5W, 5D). Ten unbeaten in the league is the longest run for the club since Christophe Galtier took charge in December 2009.
- ASSE are third in the attack table with 24 goals (with Paris Saint-Germain). They had scored twice in each of their previous four league games before their win in Valenciennes. Only Valenciennes and Olympique Lyonnais (28 each) have scored more times in L1 this season.
- Aubameyang had scored in three straight L1 games for the first time in his career before drawing a blank against Evian. He is ASSE's top scorer with eight, fourth overall in L1.
- Aubameyang and Renaud Cohade have four assists each.
- ASSE are top of the defence table with ten goals conceded.
- ASSE have kept eight clean sheets.
- Saint-Etienne are yet to concede a goal before the 29th-minute of a league game this season.
- Saint-Etienne top the Fair Play table with 18 cautions and a single red card.
- Jonathan Brison (v Sochaux, Wk 5) is the only Saint-Etienne player to have been sent-off so far this season.
- HOME FORM: With 16 points garnered from their eight home games to date (5W 1D 2L), Saint-Etienne have the third-best home record in L1.
- OL boast the best home record, having picked up 21 points from their eight home matches (7W 1L).
- Only three L1 teams (OL, Valenciennes and Toulouse FC) have scored more goals than Saint-Etienne in home matches this





season.

- Only Ajaccio can match Saint-Etienne's tally of three goals conceded at home this season, and the Corsican club has played one home game fewer than Les Verts.
- Saint-Etienne have not conceded at home in L1 since Thierry Doubaï struck in the 75th-minute to earn Sochaux a 1-0 win in Week 5, five matches (4W 1D) and 15 minutes ago.
- Having also kept a clean sheet against PSG in the Coupe de la Ligue (see below), Saint-Etienne have not conceded in six home games in all competitions.
- Saint-Etienne have conceded four goals in their last 11 competitive outings.
- Saint-Etienne have won all five home games in which they have scored the opening goal and lost the two in which they conceded the first score.
- COUPE DE LA LIGUE: ASSE reached the semi-finals, beating PSG 5-3 on penalties after a goalless draw after extra-time. While Les Verts scored all of their penalties, including Aubameyang's decisive fifth, Thiago Silva saw PSG's fourth spot-kick saved by Les Verts' goalkeeper Stéphane Ruffier.
- ASSE will play host to LOSC Lille in the last four on 15 January.
- ASSE were 3-0 winners at Sochaux in the Round of 16. Romain Hamouma (10' and 68') and Alejandro Alonso (88') got the goals in a convincing team performance. Sochaux keeper Pierrick Cros went off midway through the first half with a nasty knee injury. Coach Christophe Galtier said: "The Coupe de la Ligue is an objective and we'll play it flat out."
- Saint-Etienne beat FC Lorient away in the Round of 32, triumphing 3-0 in a penalty shoot-out after the game finished 1-1 after 90 minutes and extra time.
- SUSPENSIONS: Galtier's assistant coach, Alain Blachon, starts a two-game touchline ban after being sent to the stands during the team's Week 9 game at OGC Nice.
- INJURIES: Brandao limped off at Ajaccio with a muscle problem and is a doubt.
- TRIVIA
- Jérémy Clément started his pro career at OL. The midfielder made his L1 debut with OL in a 3-0 victory against Stade Rennais FC in Week 33 of the 03-04 campaign, making 34 L1 appearances (1 goal) in all before teaming up with former OL boss Paul Le Guen at Scottish club Glasgow Rangers.
- Full-back François Clerc also made his L1 debut with OL, also against Rennes, in a Week 10 triumph in Brittany (1-3) in the 2005-06 campaign. He made 78 L1 appearances (1 goal) for OL, with only 16 of those coming in his final two seasons at Stade Municipal de Gerland before he joined OGC Nice in 2010.
- Galtier was assistant coach at OL under Alain Perrin in the 2007-08 season, which ended with the club winning the double of Ligue 1 and the French Cup.
- Clément, Faouzi Ghoulam, Hamouma and Loïc Perrin visited ill children at Saint-Etienne's North Hospital this week.
- Ghoulam travelled to Algiers last Sunday to meet with local press and the Algerian FA announced he has been registered with FIFA to play for them at senior international level. The full-back has already played for France's Under-21 side.
- The last remaining tickets for the game were sold on Tuesday. The capacity crowd will be able to arrive early for the game with the Stade Geoffroy-Guichard gates being opened two hours before kick-off.
- Norwegian teenage midfielder Eirik Birkelund announced this week he had agreed an 18-month contract with Saint-Etienne, who will pay his current club, Brann Bergen, ?300,000.
- Saint-Etienne president Roland Romeyer said the difference between OL goalkeeper Rémy Vercoutre and Les Verts' number one Stéphane Ruffier was "like a 2CV and a Ferrari".
- Prior to kick-off, Aubameyang will receive the Player of the Month Award for November from player's union, the UNFP.





- Robert Salen, who played on the right wing in the 1963-64 title-winning side, died this week aged 76.

- OLYMPIQUE LYONNAIS

- GENERAL: Lyon came into the weekend in top spot in Ligue 1 on 31 points (9W 4D 2L), two points clear of second-placed Olympique de Marseille.

- After hitting the top-flight summit with a convincing 4-1 win at Marseille in a rearranged Week 10 match, OL maintained their position with a 1-0 victory at home to Montpellier Hérault SC last weekend - Gomis (26') scored the only goal of the game.

- OL line-up v Montpellier: Vercoret; Réveillère, Bisevac, Umtiti, Dabo; Malbranque, Gonalons; Lacazette (Bastos 61'), Grenier (Fofana 86'), Ghezzal (Gourcuff 75'); Gomis

- Lyon have lost just once in their last eight league games, winning five of those.

- OL are joint-top of the L1 attack table, along with Valenciennes, on 28 goals.

- The 2-0 defeat at home to Bordeaux in Week 7 and the 3-0 away loss at TFC in Week 14 are the only games in which OL have failed to score.

- They have scored three goals or more on five separate occasions

- Gomis has ten for the season, making him second only to PSG's Zlatan Ibrahimovic (13) in the L1 scoring table. Lisandro is next in line for OL with five.

- Gomis has 82 goals in L1 overall and since he made his debut in 04-05 making him the top scorer in that period ahead of Kevin Gameiro (71) and Mevlut Erding (58).

- Malbranque is the club's leading assists provider with five in 11 games and has also contributed two goals.

- OL are joint-fourth in the defence table with 15 goals conceded.

- They have kept five clean sheets and their 3-0 defeat at Toulouse in Week 14 was the first league game in which they had conceded more than two this season.

- OL are second in the Fair Play table with 21 yellow cards and just the one red, shown to Dejan Lovren against Bastia in Week 11.

- AWAY FORM: Only four teams have picked up more points on their travels than OL this season (10 points, 2W 4D 1L).

- The loss in Toulouse is their only away-day reverse in L1 this season, and is their only loss in five away games in all competitions (3W).

- OL are unbeaten when they have taken the lead away from home this season (2W 2D), and have come from behind to claim two points from the three games in which they have conceded the opening goal.

- TROPHÉE DES CHAMPIONS: OL won the traditional curtain-raiser to the season, beating Montpellier 4-2 on penalties after a 2-2 draw at the Red Bull Arena, home of the New York Red Bulls, in Harrison, New Jersey.

- COUPE DE LA LIGUE: As one of France's European representatives, last season's runners-up Lyon earned a bye directly through to the last 16, where they were beaten 3-1 at OGC Nice.

- EUROPA LEAGUE: Thanks to their victory in last season's Coupe de France, OL were one of seven clubs who qualified directly for the Europa League group stages.

- Lyon were drawn in Group I alongside Israeli champions Hapoel Kiryat Shmona, Sparta Prague of the Czech Republic and last season's runners-up, Athletic Bilbao of Spain.

- Rémi Garde's men were the only side in the competition to have won all of their first four group games. As a result, OL were qualified for the tournament's knockout stages before a young side took a 1-1 draw at Sparta Prague on Matchday 5.

- Lyon capped Group I with a 2-0 home win over Hapoel Kiryat Shmona courtesy of goals from Naby Sarr (15') and Yassine Benzia





(58').

- **SUSPENSIONS:** None.

- Maxime Gonalons will serve a one-match ban after the game having accumulated three yellow cards in fewer than ten competitive domestic outings.

- **INJURIES:** Rémi Garde declared it was "highly unlikely" Lisandro Lopez would recover from a calf injury to play. Dejan Lovren, though he returned to training this week, is still out after a thigh injury while Jimmy Briand (hamstring) is also sidelined. A host of first-choice players, including Gomis, were rested for Thursday's Europa League and will return.

- **TRIVIA**

- Gomis started his pro career at Saint-Etienne after coming through the club's youth academy. After making his L1 debut in the opening game of the 2004-05 season, he went on to appear 131 times in the top flight, scoring 38 times before joining OL in a 15m euro move in summer 2009. He struck the only goal of the game on his return to his former club in Week 12 of the following season.

- Dabo made his L1 debut with Les Verts towards the end of the 2004-05 campaign. He made 115 top-flight appearances (1 goal) before joining Spanish side Sevilla in summer 2010.

- Steed Malbranque joined Saint-Etienne from English club Sunderland in summer 2011, but played just 27 minutes of L1 football for Les Verts before his contract was ended by mutual consent.

- Gomis is just four goals behind Peguy Luyindula, the PSG striker who is the leading goalscorer in Ligue 1 of all current players.

- OL president Jean-Michel Aulas this week advised PSG's Qatari owners to be patient with speculation growing over the position of the capital club's coach, Carlo Ancelotti. "It's always difficult to succeed when we want things to move quickly," he said. "Paris will be competitive in the Champions League so they absolutely shouldn't change what they've done so far, even if it's tougher in the league."

- Aulas revealed that Galtier had sent him a text message on Monday, "a personal message, nice but ambitious," he said, adding: "It's good because it serves to calm down certain things which add nothing positive to big matches like this."

- Garde said this week he "goes to sleep every night dreaming of the title, and I hope my players do the same."

- Stade Brestois 29 coach Landry Chauvin this week praised Yoann Gourcuff, whom he coached at Stade Rennais FC's youth academy. "The most talented of all, who I only had for a year, was Yoann Gourcuff," he said. "He's the most gifted of all, the most intelligent. For me, talent is intelligence."

AS Saint-Etienne

- Saint-Etienne are France's most successful club, with ten Ligue 1 titles (1957, 1964, 1967, 1968, 1969, 1970, 1974, 1975, 1976 and 1981) and six French Cups (1962, 1968, 1970, 1974, 1975 and 1977).

- Les Verts are one of four French clubs to have reached a European Cup final, having lost 1-0 to Bayern Munich in Glasgow in 1976. Reims (1956 and 1959), Marseille (1991 and 1993) and Monaco (2004) are the others.

- Saint-Etienne finished in 7th place in Ligue 1 in 2011/12

-ASSE lost to OL in the last-16 of the Coupe de la Ligue (1-2)

-ASSE lost 4-2 on pens to Bordeaux in the round of 64 of the French Cup

- Former France internationals Grégory Coupet and Willy Sagnol are both products of the Saint-Etienne youth system.

- Notable former Saint-Etienne players include French internationals Michel Platini, Bernard Lacombe, Patrick Battiston and Laurent Blanc. Former France national coaches Aimé Jacquet and Jacques Santini both also played for Les Verts.

- Coach Christophe Galtier took over on 15 December 2009, when Alain Perrin was sacked after the Week 17 3-0 defeat to Paris Saint-Germain.





- Galtier was previously assistant coach to Alain Perrin at Al-Ayn (UAE, 2004), Portsmouth (ENG, 2005), FC Sochaux (2006-07), Olympique Lyonnais (2007-08), AS Saint-Etienne (2008-déc 2009).
- Top scorer least season: Gabon striker Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang, 16 goals, followed by Ivorian Max-Alain Gradel, six goals
- Top assists: Aubameyang, six
- Average home attendance 21, 478 (80% of capacity)

Olympique Lyonnais

- Last season Lyon finished fourth in Ligue 1 with 64 points - ten points behind third-placed Lille - and will not feature in the 2012-2013 Champions League after 13 straight seasons of having qualified for Europe's premier continental club competition.
- In 2011-2012 OL did at least put an end to their trophy drought as they won the Coupe de France beating amateur club Quevilly (National, D3) 1-0 at the Stade de France. Lisandro Lopez scored the only goal of the game. OL hadn't claimed silverware since doing the Ligue1-Coupe de France double in 2008.
- Lyon won the Trophée des Champions on July 28 2012, beating Ligue 1 champions Montpellier 4-2 on penalties in New York after the sides had played out a 2-2 draw.
- Lyon parted company with coach Claude Puel in the summer of 2011. Puel failed to win any silverware in his time in charge, although he did lead the club to the semi-finals of the Champions League for the first time in their history in 2009-10, beating Real Madrid and Bordeaux before losing to Bayern Munich in the last four.
- Prior to Puel's arrival in 2008 Lyon had won the Ligue 1 title seven seasons in a row.
- Puel's successor Rémi Garde is in his first spell in charge of a professional club.
- Born locally, Garde spent nine years as a player at Lyon between 1984 and 1993, forming part of the team that won promotion to Ligue 1 in 1989. He went on to play for Strasbourg and Arsenal, before returning to Lyon to work as assistant under Paul Le Guen and Gérard Houllier. Prior to taking the first-team reins he was working for the club's academy.
- Four different coaches have taken Lyon to the Ligue 1 title: Jacques Santini (2002), Paul Le Guen (2003, 04, 05), Gérard Houllier (2006, 07) and Alain Perrin (2008).
- OL president Jean-Michel Aulas took over in 1987, with the club in the second division. They were promoted to Ligue 1 in 1989 under former France coach Raymond Domenech.
- Special advisor to Aulas, Bernard Lacombe played for Lyon between 1969 and 1978 - winning the 1973 French Cup and scoring 123 of his 255 Ligue 1 goals - before joining Saint-Etienne and then Bordeaux where he won three Ligue 1 titles and a further two French Cups.
- Record signing Lisandro Lopez scored 48 goals in 88 Ligue 1 games in his first three seasons at the club after joining from Porto for a reported 24 million Euros in 2009.
- 2009-2010 Ligue 1 player of the year Lisandro was club top scorer in 2011-2012 with 16 Ligue 1 goals.
