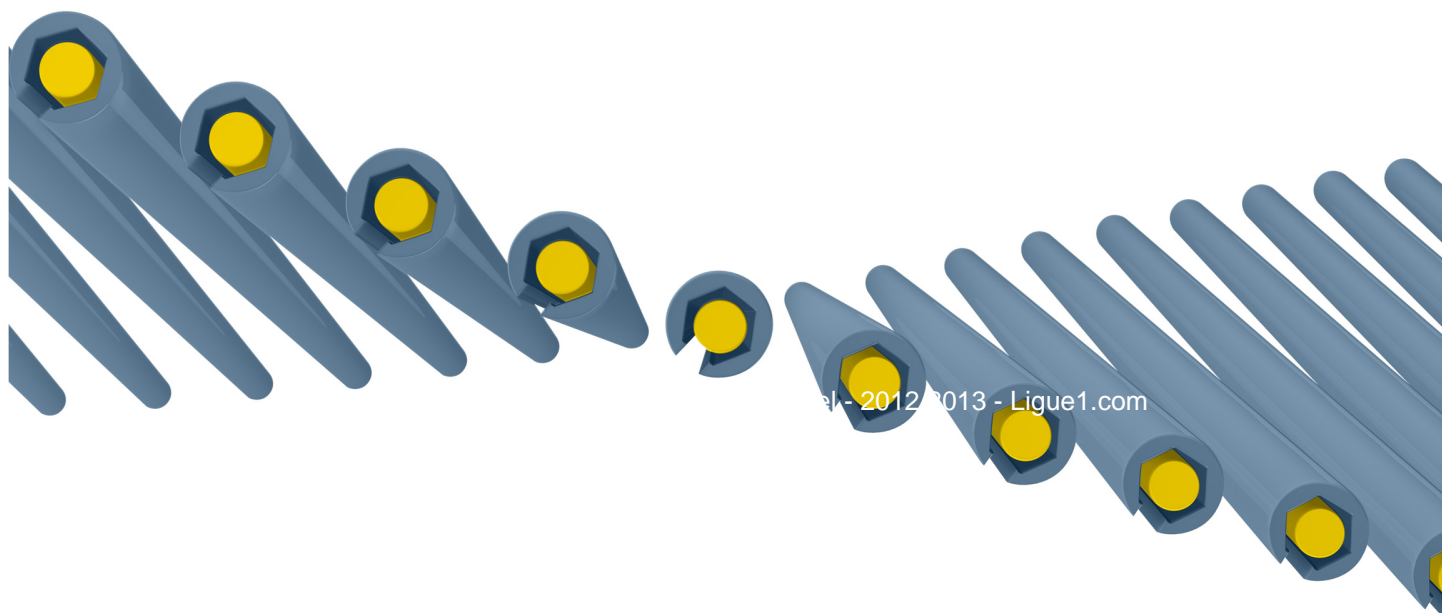

PREVIEW : TOULOUSE FC - SC BASTIA

Toulouse FC - SC Bastia Feature Preview

Toulouse FC coach Alain Casanova is looking for his team to rediscover the consistency they showed earlier in the campaign as they entertain SC Bastia at Le Stadium on Friday evening.

Toulouse sat in third place after losing just one of their opening ten games, but have since lost four times in five, a run that followed on the back of their Coupe de la Ligue Round of 16 exit at Lille. In the last fortnight, Casanova has seen his men take apart Lyon in a 3-0 victory at Le Stadium, and then produce a lame display in going down 1-0 at FC Lorient last time out.

That reverse in Brittany means Toulouse come into their first top-flight meeting with Bastia since April 2005 in eighth place, although they can climb provisionally back into the top six with a win. But the question is; which Toulouse will turn up?

"Our inconsistency over the last five games is somewhat annoying," said Casanova this week. "At Lorient, we failed to adapt to the surface, our opponents made it difficult for us, and some of the players did not perform to their usual standard. I expected better after what we did against Lyon. These defeats can happen to a young team that lacks maturity. We still maybe lack a bit of experience, but we need to be more consistent if we want this to be a good season."

Toulouse's recent difficulties are perhaps partly down to injury problems and, while Serge Aurier and Moussa Sissoko have overcome fitness issues to make the squad this weekend, powerful Tunisian international defender Aymen Abdennour (heel) misses the game. In addition, the home midfield will be without the considerable presence of Etienne Capoue. The French international, who has touched the ball more, and made more passes, than any other player in Ligue 1 this season, serves a one-match suspension.

That will give Bastia, who will be "tenacious opponents" in the eyes of Casanova, real hope that they can spring a surprise here. Frédéric Hantz's side have not won any of their last seven away games, but they did hold LOSC Lille to a goalless draw in the North last Saturday to boost the confidence of a fragile defence that has let in 33 goals so far. Across Europe's five major leagues, only German Bundesliga club Hoffenheim (36) have let in more.

"Lille and Toulouse are similar," said Hantz. "Toulouse are a well organised team who play ambitious football, especially at home. They are a formidable team, strong collectively with players who are rigorous and know one another well. But I think we are capable of repeating the performance we produced at Lille.

"We will need to do better going forward. If we want to become an established Ligue 1 team, we need to be capable of competing with sides from the top ten. We need to play well for 90 minutes and then repeat these performances from one week to the next. This match is a test for us in that sense."

Bastia, who have won just one of their last five outings but can move provisionally into the top half in the event of a victory, are missing both Sylvain Marchal and Yannick Cahuzac. However, Jérôme Rothen, Toifilou Maoulida and Wahbi Khazri are all back in the squad.

As an aside, this game will also feature a clash of two of the leading strikers in Ligue 1 this season. Wissam Ben Yedder has scored nine times for TFC, while Anthony Modeste has scored six league goals, and eight in all competitions, since joining Bastia on loan from Bordeaux in the summer. Only Zlatan Ibrahimovic and Bafétimbi Gomis have scored more than Ben Yedder, while Ibrahimovic is the only player to have managed more shots on goal than Modeste, who is flourishing in Corsica after a difficult last season with Bordeaux and on loan at Blackburn Rovers in England.





Toulouse FC - SC Bastia

- HISTORY: Toulouse and Bastia have met on nine previous occasions in the south-west, with the TFC winning six, Bastia winning two and the remaining confrontation ending in a draw. Toulouse have scored 17 goals to Bastia's seven in this fixture.
- These clubs last met in season 2004-05, when Bastia were last in the top flight. Toulouse beat the Corsicans 1-0 at Le Stadium in November 2004 thanks to a second-half goal from Nicolas Dieuze. Then, Bastia won the return 2-1 at the Stade Armand-Cesari on April 16, 2005. Pierre-Yves André netted both goals for the home team in that game, with Achille Emana scoring for Toulouse. The Bastia line-up that day was captained by Nicolas Penneteau, now of Valenciennes, while Pascal Chimbonda, who later went to the 2006 World Cup with France, also started.
- Bastia last won in Toulouse on August 30, 2003, when Florian Maurice and Chaouki Ben Saada got the goals. Alou Diarra was part of the Bastia line-up that day.
- The biggest win in this fixture remains a 4-0 victory for Toulouse in December 1983.
- TOULOUSE FC
- GENERAL: Toulouse come into Week 16 in eighth place in Ligue 1 with 22 points from 15 games. They are three points adrift of Valenciennes in fifth, but just one point above Lorient in 11th.
- Toulouse have won six, drawn four and lost five of their games to date. They lost just one of their first ten matches, but have since been beaten four times in five games.
- After 15 games last season, Toulouse sat in sixth place with 26 points. They were two points behind Lille in third and boasted the best defensive record in the division, having conceded just 12 times. However, the TFC are one point, and four places, better off than at the same FC stage in 2010-11.
- Alain Casanova's side rose to as high as third place after Week 10. They sat in 12th place after the opening week of the season, but have been permanent members of the top nine since then.
- In their last Ligue 1 outing, Toulouse lost 1-0 away at FC Lorient
- The Toulouse line-up at Lorient: Ahamada; Akpa-Akpro, Zebina (c), Yago (Rivière, 60'), M'Bengué; Capoue; Regattin (Djaló, 74'), Sissoko (Sirieix, 46'), Didot, Tabanou; Ben Yedder.
- Toulouse have scored 23 goals so far this season. Only four clubs have scored more. They have scored three goals or more on three occasions, including in a 4-0 win at Evian TG FC in Week 9. They have failed to score at all in four games, including in three of their last five.
- Wissam Ben Yedder is Toulouse's leading scorer with nine goals. Only Zlatan Ibrahimovic (13) and Bafétimbi Gomis (10) have managed more than Ben Yedder in Ligue 1 this season.
- Emmanuel Rivière and Etienne Capoue have both scored three league goals.
- Etienne Didot has provided four assists, while Franck Tabanou has laid on three goals.
- Les Violets have scored just eight of their goals in the first half of games.
- Toulouse have conceded 17 times this season, giving them the ninth-best defence in Ligue 1. The 4-2 home defeat to AC Ajaccio (Wk 12) is the only game in which they have conceded more than twice since a 3-1 defeat at Paris Saint-Germain on January 14. They have kept four clean sheets.
- No Toulouse player has appeared in every match this season, but Etienne Capoue, Ali Ahamada and Franck Tabanou have all started 14 of their side's 15 games. Moussa Sissoko (13 starts, one substitute appearance), Wissam Ben Yedder and Etienne Didot (both 12 starts, two sub apps) have also appeared in 14 matches.
- Emmanuel Rivière is Toulouse's most frequently used substitute, having come off the bench nine times. Daniel Braaten has come off the bench eight times.
- Toulouse currently lie 12th in the Fair Play table. They have received 27 yellow cards and two red cards this season. Adrien Regattin





and Serge Aurier were both dismissed in the 1-1 draw at Montpellier on the opening day of the campaign.

-Toulouse had 67 percent of the possession in their 4-2 home defeat to AC Ajaccio (Wk 12), a record share of the ball in Ligue 1 this season.

-Etienne Capoue has touched the ball 1,221 times this season, 77 times more than the next player on the list, Maxime Gonalons of Lyon.

-Capoue has also made more passes (1,084) than any other player. He has completed 849 of those. Only Maxime Gonalons and Saint-Etienne's Jérémy Clément have completed more.

-Toulouse average 26.3 crosses per match. Only Olympique de Marseille (28.4) average more.

-If he starts, Serge Aurier will be starting for the 50th time in a Ligue 1 game. He does not turn 20 until December 24.

-HOME FORM: Toulouse have won three, drawn three and lost one of seven home games this season. They have taken 12 points at Le Stadium, scoring 15 goals and conceding 11, giving them the 11th-best home record in Ligue 1.

-Toulouse have recorded home wins against Saint-Etienne (2-1, Wk 2), Brest (3-1, Wk 10) and Lyon (3-0, Wk 14), and have drawn against Reims (1-1, Wk 4), Rennes (2-2, Wk 6) and Valenciennes (2-2, Wk 8). Their one defeat came at the hands of Ajaccio (2-4, Wk 12).

-Games at Le Stadium have featured 26 goals. Only those at Bastia (27) have featured more.

-The average attendance at Le Stadium this season is 16,171, the ninth-highest in Ligue 1. Their biggest crowd thus far is 31,188 against Brest (Wk 10) while a low of 10,431 watched the meeting with Ajaccio (Wk 12).

-COUPE DE LA LIGUE: After winning 1-0 away to Ligue 2 side SM Caen in the Round of 32, Toulouse were knocked out in the Round of 16, losing 1-0 away to LOSC Lille after extra time.

-INTERNATIONALS: Aymen Abdennour (Tunisia) and Adrien Regattin (Morocco) are in line to be called up for duty at the Africa Cup of Nations in South Africa from January 19-February 10. French-born duo Serge Aurier and Wissam Ben Yedder have been tentatively approached by the Ivory Coast and Tunisia respectively.

-TRANSFERS IN: Jonathan Zébina from Brest under freedom of contract, Olivier Blondel from ESTAC Troyes, Yannick Djaló on a season-long loan from Benfica (POR).

-OUT: Paulo Machado to Olympiacos (GRE) on a three-year deal, Daniel Congré to Montpellier Hérault SC, Umut Bulut on a season-long loan to Galatasaray (TUR), Mohamed Fofana and Antoine Devaux to Stade de Reims, Rémy Riou to FC Nantes, Anthony Loustallot to Rodez, Hendrick Cakin (released), Amadou Soukouna on loan to Luzenac.

-TEAM NEWS: SUSPENSIONS: Etienne Capoue serves a one-match suspension. Etienne Didot can play before a serving a one-game ban against Lille next Tuesday.

-INJURIES: Aymen Abdennour is still sidelined with a heel problem, but Moussa Sissoko is in the squad despite coming off at half time against Lorient. Serge Aurier has recovered from an adductor problem.

-SC BASTIA

-GENERAL: Bastia come into Week 16 in 12th place in Ligue 1 with 18 points from 15 games. They are three points clear of the relegation zone and three points adrift of Lille in tenth.

-Bastia have won five, drawn three and lost seven of their games to date. After going four matches unbeaten from Week 7-10, the Corsicans have won just one of their last five outings.

-After 15 games of Bastia's last top-flight campaign, season 2004-05, they lay in the relegation zone, in 18th spot with 14 points. After 15 games in 2003-04, Bastia were 13th, but with 19 points, eight points clear of the drop zone.

-Frédéric Hantz's side were second in the table after Week 1, before dropping progressively to 16th after Week 7. They then sunk to a low of 17th after Week 13. They have been permanent fixtures in the bottom half since Week 5.

-Bastia drew 0-0 away to LOSC Lille in their last outing.





- The Bastia line-up at Lille: Bonnefoi; Cioni (Keita, 72'), Choplin, Angoula (c), Harek; Yatabaré, Sablé; Palmieri, Thauvin; Modeste, Ilan.
- Bastia have scored 21 goals this season. Only six clubs have scored more, including Friday's opponents Toulouse. They have scored three goals on three separate occasions, most recently in the 3-1 home win against Bordeaux (Wk 10). They have failed to score at all in six matches, including in two of their last three outings.
- Anthony Modeste is Bastia's leading league scorer with six goals, followed by Wahbi Khazri and Toifilou Maoulida, who have three each. Modeste has eight in all competitions, while Maoulida has five altogether.
- Khazri has also provided four assists. Only three players (Gaë Danic, Mathieu Valbuena, Steed Malbranque) have provided more in the whole of Ligue 1.
- Bastia have conceded 33 goals, more than any other club in Ligue 1. Only TSG 1899 Hoffenheim (36) have conceded more in all of Europe's recognised five leading leagues (English Premier League, Spanish Primera Liga, German Bundesliga, Italian Serie A, Ligue 1).
- Hantz's side have conceded three goals or more on seven occasions in Ligue 1 this season, including in a 5-2 defeat at Lyon (Wk 11) and a 4-0 home loss to Paris Saint-Germain (Wk 6). Last week's clean sheet at Lille was just their second in the league.
- No Bastia player has appeared in every game this season, but Anthony Modeste has started 14 of the 15 Ligue 1 games, while Fethi Harek (13 starts, one substitute appearance), Toifilou Maoulida (11 starts, 3 sub apps) and Wahbi Khazri (10 starts, 4 sub apps) have also appeared 14 times.
- Julian Palmieri and Sambou Yatabaré have both come off the bench five times, more than any other Bastia players this season.
- Bastia lie bottom of the Fair Play table, having received 40 bookings - more than any other club - and five red cards. Only Lorient (6) have had more sendings-off. Ilan (v Rennes, Wk 3), Gaël Angoula (v Ajaccio, 9), Fethi Harek (v Lyon, Wk 11), François Marque (v Brest, Wk 13) and Anthony Modeste (v Lorient, Wk 14) have all been dismissed this season.
- If he plays, Sambou Yatabaré will make his 50th Ligue 1 appearance.
- Toifilou Maoulida made his 350th Ligue 1 appearance in his last outing against Lorient (Wk 14).
- Bastia's tally of 28 shots in the 2-1 win against Reims (Wk 2) is the most by any team in one game this season.
- Anthony Modeste has had 51 shots on goal. Only Zlatan Ibrahimovic (54) has managed more in Ligue 1 this season.
- AWAY FORM: Bastia have won one, drawn three and lost four of their eight away matches in Ligue 1. They have taken six points on their travels. Only four clubs have picked up fewer points away from home.
- Hantz's side won at Sochaux (3-2, Wk 1), but have since failed to win any of their last seven away games. They have drawn at Nice (2-2, Wk 7), Ajaccio (0-0, Wk 9) and Lille (0-0, Wk 15), and been beaten at Rennes (3-2, Wk 3), Evian TG FC (3-0, Wk 5), Lyon (5-2, Wk 11) and Brest (3-0, Wk 13).
- Bastia have scored nine goals and conceded 18 on their travels this season. Only Troyes (19 from seven games) have let in more away from home.
- COUPE DE LA LIGUE: Bastia beat FC Metz (3-0) and AJ Auxerre (1-0) on the way to the quarter-finals, where they were beaten 3-0 at home by LOSC Lille on November 28.
- INTERNATIONALS: Sambou Yatabaré (Mali) and Wahbi Khazri (Tunisia) are the two members of the Bastia squad who could go to the Africa Cup of Nations, which will be held in South Africa from January 19-February 10.
- TRANSFERS IN: Ilan from AC Ajaccio, Sylvain Marchal from AS Saint-Etienne, Julian Palmieri from FC Istres, Sambou Yatabaré from AS Monaco, Landry Bonnefoi from Amiens SC, Gaëtan Varenne from Cournon, Anthony Modeste on loan from Girondins de Bordeaux.
- OUT: Sadio Diallo to Stade Rennais (had moved to Bretons in January before returning to Bastia on loan for last six months of last season), Ludovic Genest on loan to FC Istres, David Suarez to AC Arles-Avignon, Jacques-Désiré Périatambée (released), Mathieu





Robail to Nîmes Olympique (freedom of contract), Florent André on loan to Fréjus Saint-Raphaël, Amiran Sanaia (released).

-TEAM NEWS: SUSPENSIONS: None. Florian Thauvin can play before serving a one-match ban against Olympique de Marseille next Wednesday.

-INJURIES: Sylvain Marchal and Yannick Cahuzac are both sidelined. Jérôme Rothen, Toifilou Maoulida and Wahbi Khazri are all back in the squad.

-TRIVIA: Bastia's board, coaching staff, players and supporters have signed a collective good behaviour charter in a bid to avoid a repeat of the incident in the recent Coupe de la Ligue quarter-final defeat to LOSC Lille, when an assistant referee was struck by a missile. The charter is called 'Uniti Vinceremu' in Corsican, which translates as 'Together We Will Win'.

-The LFP's disciplinary committee has decided that Bastia's next home game - against Marseille on Wednesday - must be played behind closed doors as a punishment for trouble involving their supporters in the Corsican derby away to AC Ajaccio on October 21.

-Jonathan Zebina and Landry Bonnefoi were both on the books at Juventus, crossing paths between 2004 and 2007.

-Emmanuel Rivière and Julien Sablé played together at Saint-Etienne until the latter left for RC Lens in 2007.

-Toifilou Maoulida played alongside Serge Aurier at Lens, having previously been a teammate of Etienne Didot at Stade Rennais FC.

-Gaël Angoula's elder brother Aldo also plays in Ligue 1, for Evian TG FC.

-Yannick Cahuzac is the son of Pierre Cahuzac, who was the coach of Bastia when the Corsicans made it to the 1978 UEFA Cup final.

Toulouse FC

- Toulouse have never won the French league. Their highest-ever finish is third, which they achieved in 1986-87, and again in 2006-07. The latter performance qualified the TFC for their only Champions League campaign to date (eliminated in the third qualifying round by Liverpool (ENG), 5-0 on aggregate).

- Toulouse's only top-tier silverware remains the 1957 French Cup, although they have been crowned Ligue 2 champions on three occasions (1953, 1981 and 2003).

- After finishing 17th in Ligue 1 in 2001, TFC were relegated to the third tier by France's financial watchdog, the DNCG. They came back up in 2003 and have been in Ligue 1 ever since.

- For the second season running, Toulouse finished eighth in Ligue 1 in 2011-12, with 56 points. They were knocked out of the Coupe de France at the last-64 stage by third-tier Gazélec Ajaccio and out of the Coupe de la Ligue by OGC Nice in the Round of 32.

- Toulouse conceded just 34 goals in 2011-12, giving them the joint-best defensive record in Ligue 1 along with champions Montpellier. However, they scored just 37 goals, with only Lorient and Brest managing fewer over the course of the season. In nine seasons since coming up in 2003, Toulouse have averaged more than a goal a game in only two campaigns.

- Toulouse coach Alain Casanova replaced Elie Baup in the summer of 2008 after 13 years as the club's assistant coach.

- A goalkeeper during his playing days, Casanova spent two years at Marseille and was on the bench during OM's defeat to Red Star Belgrade (SRB) in the 1991 European Cup final in Bari, Italy.

- Toulouse play at the 35,575-capacity, municipally-owned Stadium, situated on Ile du Ramier in the centre of the city. The ground hosted matches at the 1998 World Cup and also hosts the bigger games of the city's leading rugby club, Stade Toulousain.





SC Bastia

- Sporting Club de Bastia are back in Ligue 1 for the first time since season 2004-05 when they were relegated after finishing 19th, ending a run of 11 consecutive seasons in the top flight.
- The Corsican club won the Ligue 2 title last season to seal a second consecutive promotion, following in the footsteps of Evian-Thonon-Gaillard and Arles-Avignon before them. They have not lost a home league game at the Stade Armand-Cesari in either of the last two seasons.
- Midfielder Jérôme Rothen was named Ligue 2's Player of the Season for 2011-12, while Magno Novaes was named goalkeeper of the year and Frédéric Hantz coach of the year. Novaes, Rothen, Fethi Harek, Sadio Diallo and Wahbi Khazri were all included in the Ligue 2 team of the season.
- Founded in 1905, they also won the second-tier title in 1967-68. Their only major trophy success is the Coupe de France in 1981, when they beat Saint-Etienne 2-1 in the final, with Cameroon great Roger Milla among the scorers.
- After a best-ever third-place finish in 1977, I Turchini also reached the UEFA Cup final in 1978, losing 3-0 on aggregate to PSV Eindhoven (NED).
- The 13,584-capacity Stade Armand-Cesari is in Furiani, just outside Bastia, and was the scene of one of Europe's worst stadium disasters when, in May 1992, a temporary stand collapsed prior to the Coupe de France semi-final against Olympique de Marseille, killing 18 fans and injuring thousands.
- Coach Hantz, who played notably for FC Metz and OGC Nice, has overseen Bastia's Championnat National and Ligue 2 title triumphs since taking over in 2010. He has also coached Le Mans, Sochaux and Le Havre, who were relegated from Ligue 1 under Hantz in 2009.

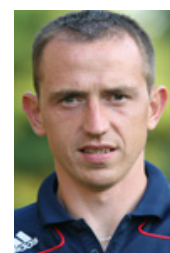
